WHAT IS HFLS?

The Hebrew Free Loan Society fosters **economic stability** and **opportunity** among low-and moderate-income New Yorkers in need by providing access to **safe**, **affordable credit** in the form of **0%-interest loans**. Our lending is structured to help New Yorkers in need weather financial emergencies and invest in their futures. HFLS is non-sectarian, helping those in need within and beyond the Jewish community.

HFLS was founded in **1892** by ten leaders of the Jewish immigrant community on Manhattan's Lower East Side. These friends pooled \$95 to create an interest-free loan fund and made loans starting at 50ϕ .

Today, we continue that tradition of making safe, affordable credit available to New Yorkers who want to invest in their future but cannot afford it or do not qualify for commercial credit.

HFLS maintains a **99.9% repayment rate**. Since our founding, HFLS has provided over **\$300 million** to more than **875,000 borrowers**. As our loans are repaid, the capital is lent out again and again, **helping more people and multiplying the impact over time**.

HFLS is unique. There are no other organizations in New York City that provide an array of interest-free loans to low- and moderate-income people facing financial emergencies.

I am proud to report that by the end of this past year, HFLS had moved over \$13 million from its accounts into the hands of New Yorkers in need of safe and affordable credit.

It has always been my dream to become a speech pathologist. When I decided to go to graduate school, I knew I would be responsible for financing my education.

With the loan from the Hebrew Free Loan Society, I was able to go to grad school and protect my family from unmanageable debt. It felt so wonderful when I was approved for the loan. I thought, 'I can do this. I am back on track with my goals.'

I graduated from Adelphi University with a Master's degree in speech pathology. Now I'm in a clinical fellowship at a charter school in Brooklyn. I accomplished all of this because of the Hebrew Free Loan Society.


IMPACT BEYOND THE LOANS
